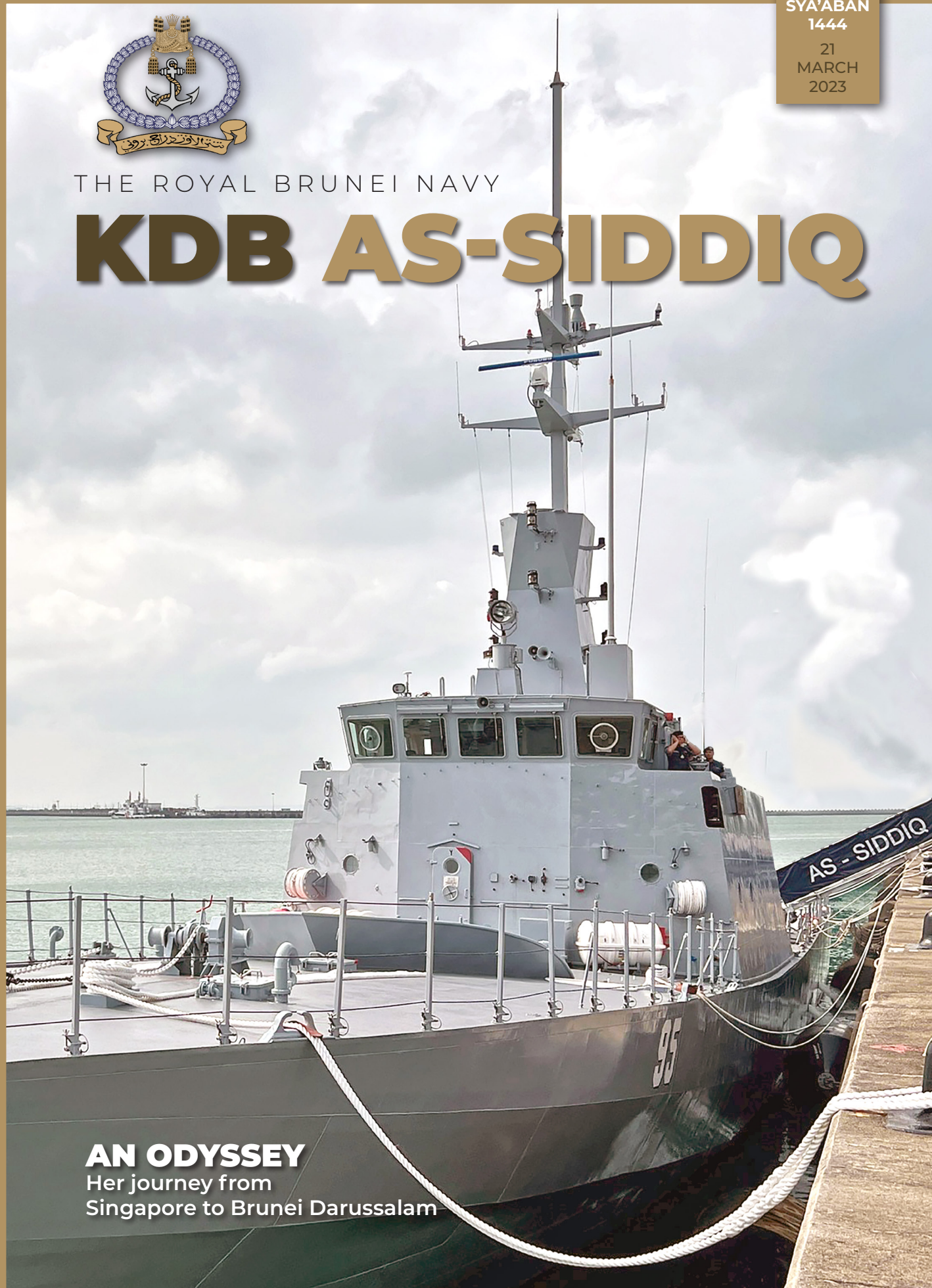

Being a part of this project and this crew is definitely one of the top highlights of my career. Prior to this, I was also involved in similar pioneering projects when I became the first crew of KDB BERKAT and KDB DARUTTAQWA. This is my third hat-trick as the first crew of a ship, now holding a **COMMAND** post. This time, however, is different, as the responsibilities, demand, and challenges are monumental.

This project is crucial in strengthening the bonds between the RBN and the RSN as both navies are committed to ensuring its success. It has improved our interpersonal relationship as it creates opportunities for us to work alongside each other ever more closely. 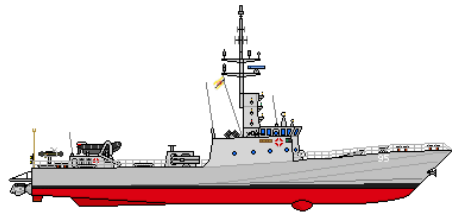


# AS-SIDDIQ ORIGINS

Built by Singapore Shipbuilding and Engineering Limited (currently known as Singapore Technologies Engineering Marine) for the RSN in the 1990s, RSS Brave was commissioned on 5 October 1996 by then Deputy Prime Minister and Minister for Defence, Dr. Tony Tan Keng Yam. RSS Brave was in service with the 182 Squadron under the Maritime Security Task Force in the execution of daily patrols, boarding, and escort operations in the Singapore Straits.

Over the years, she played a vital role in safeguarding Singapore's maritime interests and territorial integrity through various operations at sea. Of note, she also advanced defence relations by participating in international engagements. In 2001, her sister ship RSS Dauntless sailed together with the RBN's KDB WASPADA and KDB PEJUANG from Singapore to Brunei Darussalam for the 23rd edition of the bilateral Exercise Pelican.

Officiated by Chief of Navy RADM Lew Chuen Hong, the RSN decommissioned RSS Brave (P95) along with two other Fearless Class Patrol Vessels on 27 August 2019.



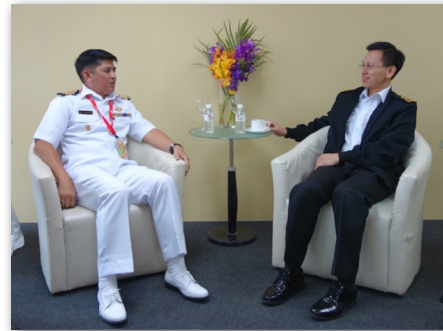

# THE HANDING OVER, TAKING OVER OF AS-SIDDIQ

The 15th of March 2023 marked a momentous occasion as the RSN officially handed over AS-SIDDIQ to RBN through the Handing Over, Taking Over and Ship Naming Ceremony. The ceremony witnessed the signing of the Certificate of Transfer between Lieutenant General Dato Paduka Seri Melvyn Ong Su Kiat, Chief of Defence Force of the Singapore Armed Forces (SAF) and Major General Dato Paduka Seri Haji Muhammad Haszaimi bin Bol Hassan, Commander of the Royal Brunei Armed Forces (RBAF).

The ceremony also witnessed the handing over of the Negara Brunei Darussalam national flag and RBN Ensign from the Commander of RBAF to CO AS-SIDDIQ as well as the presentation of the Symbol of Transfer between the Chief of Defence Force SAF and the Commander RBAF.
